ADVENT SCRIPT

Kathy's Christmas Ponderings...

There is an old Swedish Prayer that goes like this:

Fear less, hope more; Eat less, chew more; Whine less, breathe more; Talk less, say more; Hate less, love more; And all good things are yours.

One of the things that I like about that prayer is that it reminds us that we have choices – even when everything is caving in around us, we have choices – will we whine or will we breathe? Will we fear, or will we hope? When we find ourselves in situations of conflict, will we talk and talk and talk, or will we pause and find the words that really need to be said? Will we be consumed by our rage and our hate or will we dig down deep to find the heart that still has the capacity to love? The Christmas season is full of many occasions where we need to look at our choices. Maybe this is the year where we opt to order in a meal instead of spending way too many hours preparing a feast for our family. Maybe this is the year where we take the time to prepare a feast of all the favorites for our family or friends. Maybe this is the year where we opt to set a limit on how many gifts we purchase, or on how much we will actually spend on gifts. Maybe this is the year where we choose to go for a walk rather than go to the mall. Maybe this is the year where we think of someone we haven't seen for a long time and pick up the phone to be in touch again. Maybe this is the year where we think of who we can invite to eat with us who may not otherwise have anyone to share a meal with. What is it that you will do this season that will be truly lifegiving for you or for your family? If you could cast aside all the regular obligations and things that happen because You Should do them, what is it that you would do to soothe your soul or to make your heart sing? My hope and my prayer for this Christmas season is that we can clear our eyes and calm our minds to truly experience the words of the angels: "Don't be afraid; for I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people." Where will the joy be for you this season? Where will the joy be for us as a

community of faith? And how will that joy make a difference in how we make our choices and how we speak about the Christmas season with one another? May God grace us with the courage to walk into this season with open hearts and open arms – a community of faithful believers!

<u>First Sunday in Advent, November 29th</u> we will celebrate communion and receive new members by transfer and by confirmation

<u>Second Sunday in Advent, December 6th</u> will be White Gift Sunday and led primarily by our Sunday School. Your gift can be wrapped in white paper or placed in an envelope, and will be donated to Rainbow Youth which is a ministry of outreach to families in the North End of Regina

Fourth Sunday in Advent, December 20th will be a traditional advent service

December 21st at 7:00 p.m. will be our Blue Christmas/Longest night service. It is held on the longest night of the year (21st of December) to recognize that the night can

This service is a chance for anyone who is grieving or struggling with issues of loss, to come together to sing, to pray, and to light a candle of remembrance. This will help all of us enter into the Christmas season, feeling a little lighter, knowing we have companions and support on the journey.

The early service will be at **4:30 p.m**. and will be an engaging re-telling of the Christmas story, involving and engaging all ages. Stewardship Campaign 2010

Living abundantly

We have named our stewardship campaign for 2010 *Living Abundantly* – so chosen to acknowledge the many blessings and gifts we know. Stewardship allows us to express our gratitude for this abundance, and to serve in the many ways described above. As we raise awareness through this campaign, we ask you once again to put faith into action and to make a pledge. We have also added a new element to this year's campaign: the establishment of a "target for giving" for many regulars in our faith community. Without apology or awkwardness, we share the financial needs of church and directly ask our members to consider giving a predictable sum each year and for all year long.

What is the challenge?

In the past our church has had a pattern of facing a budget shortfall every year. This year is no exception, as our Finance Committee currently reports a projected deficit of approx. \$14,000. We would like to change this pattern for future years.

How can our church predict its finances more effectively?

To tackle this challenge, we have set two goals for 2010.

1.) Increased financial support

We have set a financial pledge target for the faithful of our congregation: \$1500 per year per household. This was calculated by dividing our 2010 budget needs (approx. \$300,000) by the numbers of households who contribute financially (approx. 200).

For some of us, this target is easy to reach; for others it may be more challenging or not possible. We cannot know your financial circumstances, but we encourage you to share what you can. There is no right or wrong amount; only an honest and sincere contribution is important.

2) <u>Increased numbers of pledges</u> – whether weekly, monthly or one-time – more predictability would help us.

Pledges provide our Finance Committee with more accurate information. If you pledge already, thank you. If you do not, please consider pledging. Note that if you need to change your pledge throughout the year, a phone call to our Envelope Steward is all that is required.

Stewardship packages will be delivered to each household during the week of Nov 8th, 2009. Included in the package is the Pledge Form, a self-addressed return envelope and information about the nature of financial and other support our church requires. As in past years, this information is intended to raise awareness of the financial requirements of Sunset United in order to offer our ministry. You may notice some revised materials that we hope will help newcomers and others who are not often participants in our community feel welcome and better informed about the work of Sunset. We would welcome receiving your pledge from you by November 22, 2009.

We thank you for your regular contributions that help us to offer ministry. Together we can continue to seek the fulfilment of our church mission, "living out Christ's message within and beyond Sunset."
