Sunday School 2010-11

This year as we seek to address the ongoing challenge of finding enough volunteer teachers and helpers for Sunday school, we are recruiting each of the parents to teach or assist on two or three Sundays each term (Fall/Xmas and Winter/spring). Others are welcome to volunteer also. Just let Jayne Strinholm or myself know. We will continue to use Godly Play, as part of our curriculum. Godly Play is an imaginative way of telling the Bible stories using materials and wondering questions to engage the children. This year,

Godly Play lessons will be spread out throughout the year, to add variety to the learning experience. We will have a Godly Play & Seasons of the Spirit orientation session for all parents/teachers, and anyone interested on September 12, after church. Bring your own bag lunch. This is also the first Sunday of our Sunday school program. We are also involving others from the congregation to take a session. If you have a gift or skill you would like to share with the children, please let us know.

We are also trying something new with the grade 4-8 class. We have had a puppet theatre here and it is time to use it! Each week the class will work on a bible story that the Sunday School will be learning about in the future. The class will prepare and practice the story and then present it to the younger children in their introduction/story time at the beginning of the Sunday school lesson. We hope this will engage the older children and develop some leadership/teaching skills as well. If you are interested in helping with this class please let Russell or Jayne Strinholm know.



Leaning into Advent and Christmas: Writing New Psalms for our Times Tuesday, October 12, 2010: 7:00 – 9:00 p.m.

At Sunset United Church we seek to provide many ways to worship, study and share our individual and collective stories as they overlap with the stories of our faith through the Christian Calendar. Each festival season offers images, stories and themes to help us on our own spiritual journey. This workshop will provide an opportunity to glimpse at a number of themes and scriptures that explore the seasons of Advent and Christmas. Together we will reflect on the places where our lives and our congregational journey intersect with "Hope," Peace," "Joy,"

"Love," and "Christ's birth." Workshop leader, Ray McGinnis will gently lead us from conversation and reflection to put pen to paper as we create some new psalms, spiritual poems and journal entries that speak freshly to our lives this year. No previous writing experience is necessary. Older children, youth and adults are all welcome to join, play with words and discover how God's Spirit is speaking to and through us.

Ray McGinnis is author of Writing the Sacred, published by Wood Lake Publishing Inc., now in its' third printing. Ray has taught writing workshops across North America to 10,000 participants since 1999. He attends Canadian Memorial United Church and lives in Vancouver, BC. His website is www.writetotheheart.com

Community Service Committee – Increasing Our Mission and Service Profile

Many of you are aware that this year our church initiated a new process for raising M&S funds. Formerly, all of our M&S givings (approximately 10% of our total) were taken from the congregation's general givings. However, in a measure designed to assist with keeping our budget balanced our church's current initiative outlined that for 2010, ½ of the M&S's \$22 000 objective be taken from congregational givings and ½ be funded through special appeals including education throughout 2010. In the early spring the Community Service

Committee agreed to assist with both the education and the organization of the special appeals of the M&S this year, with the intent of reviewing our role in this process in the fall. To date, our committee has increased the M&S profile by increasing the number of Minute for Missions shared during our services. There have been a total of four months of special collections to date, which has raised approximately \$1 400 for M&S. The youth groups of our congregation have also contributed to M&S fundraising by contributing approximately \$600 through a hot dog lunch and pancake supper. The Community Service Committee is proud of the efforts that they have put forth to assist the church in achieving their M&S fundraising goal and welcomes any other groups or individuals within Sunset to assist in fundraising and contribute towards this new procedure. Our committee members, like all members of Sunset, value the important work accomplished by Mission and Service and hope to see our support of this organization remain strong.

An Evening with Sauti Moja

A few years ago, Sunset United Church made a decision to support an organization called Sauti Moja, through sponsoring a child mother – a young woman who had become pregnant through sexual assault, and was shunned by the community. This is an all too common occurrence in Africa, and one of the projects of Sauti Moja is to work to support these young moms and their children so they can finish school in another community, where they are free from abuse and able to pursue a promising future.

Tim Wright is the founding Director of Sauti Moja; he is an agriculturalist from Saskatchewan, was a United Church missionary, lived in Regina, and worked internationally for 15 years with various church, government and non-government agencies. Tim will be in Regina the week of September 7, and will be preaching about his ministry at Sunset on September 12. We are also hosting an evening for our members and those from other congregations to learn about this organization and the ministries it offers. This informational evening is Thursday September 9, at 7pm at Sunset.

Sauti Moja is a Canadian charity that focuses on improved lives for indigenous people in Africa, especially the women and children living under the most-difficult conditions. We work closely with groups and communities, like the pastoral Maasai of Tanzania and Kenya, to provide new opportunities for marginalized individuals and families. Through our professional and financial assistance we cooperate with communities to renew hope and ensure a secure future. Sauti Moja also seeks to raise awareness of factors contributing to global injustice, and to facilitate change that leads to an equitable and healthy global community.
