What does the United Church believe?

Adult Membership classes – offered by Kathy Platt

You are invited to come and join with me in 4 evenings of conversation about what the United Church believes...or at least my “take” on what the United Church believes! The evenings will be focused on having open discussions that will deepen our understanding about the United Church of Canada, as well as enabling us to further articulate our own beliefs. I don’t lead these evenings as an “expert”, but rather as someone who loves to have conversations that lead us to explore our own faith and to build community with those with whom we worship. It may be that you “officially” joined the church many years ago, and would like the chance to refresh your memory about the practices of this denomination. It may be that you have been attending this church for some time and are now ready to enter more into the conversation about what “official” membership means. It may be that you are new to our community and would like to learn more about this congregation and how it relates to the national church. Please speak to me if you would like to come and join in these conversations where church membership may be an option, but where there is no obligation or expectation that you will necessarily take that step. The dates will be: Thursdays, September 24, Oct 1, 8 & 15th, from 7 – 9 p.m.

Fall “Spirituality” Evenings

“Taking Care of the Soul” – an invitation from Kathy Platt

I invite you to come and join us for a series of evenings focused on “taking care of the soul”. Each evening will be independent of the others, so feel free to come to one, or to come to them all. As I write this two of the evenings are confirmed, three are still in the planning stages. So this is what I know at this point....

1) Writing the Sacred, with Ray McGinnis: Tuesday, October 20; 7 – 9 p.m.

How can we breathe life into old bones? How can scripture be a catalyst for a vibrant expression of our life with God today? In this workshop Ray McGinnis, author of **Writing the Sacred**, offers a wide invitation to rediscover how the Hebrew Psalms can strengthen our lives. In a workshop that is one part Psalm appreciation, one part poetry appreciation and one part journal writing, McGinnis helps you discover the writer within. In practical step-by-step exercises, he shows you how writing can be a powerful ally in giving expression to your spiritual journey. He draws from a range of poems including ancient Psalms, St. Francis of Assisi, Mary Oliver and Leonard Cohen. He empowers you to write from your own sacred centre and give voice to your own cries of the spirit.

You are invited to come play with words, and explore the thin spaces where creative

writing and spirituality meet. This workshop is for both seasoned writers and those who have never put pen to paper. Join with others in a contemplative yet dynamic workshop that builds community.

As Ray is here in Regina as the “writer in residence” for Wascana Presbytery, there will be a charge for this workshop of \$10/person. This will cover the costs for the evening. If you are interested in being a part of this workshop, please give your name either to myself or Nora – there will be a limit of 30 people for this workshop.

2) An invitation to Prayer, with Rabbi Jeremy Parnes, Tues, Oct 27: 7 – 9 p.m.

I was first introduced to Jeremy at the “blessing the sun” ceremony here in Regina this past April. A small group of us gathered on the hill in Douglas Park and listened as Jeremy sang the sun up into the sky. Listening to him sing the Hebrew scriptures, watching as the sun rose, giving thanks to God for the new day – I was deeply touched. He has graciously accepted my invitation to come and spend an evening with us in prayer. He will teach us some of the melodies commonly used in their Jewish liturgies, and we will spend some time building prayer together. Please come and join with us as we listen for where the Spirit will lead us.

The other 3 evenings will be the first three weeks of November (either the Tuesday or Thursday). One of them will be spent with Daniel Dumont and Pamela Olson as they share some pictures and stories of the Holy Ground they walked on in the mountains this summer. One of them will be spent in learning some “mindful movement” – something that will enable us to deepen our connection between our physical selves and our spirituality. And the third evening will be focused on food – on nurturing body and soul as we gather around the table together. Once I have the details of the other evenings worked out, I will share them with you.

Walking our Faith – Banners held high!



On June 20th an enthusiastic multigenerational group including members from our church (pictured above), members from St. James and other United Church congregations in Regina met at Sunset. We made banners and decorated Morgan and Debra's van in preparation to "Walk Our Faith" in the Regina Pride parade. It was a beautiful day (only enough wind to keep our new banner full but not take flight). We gathered behind the Community Centre at Broad and 13th Avenue, then proceeded to walk north to Victoria Avenue and south on Albert Street to the legislature (stopping traffic as the parade went across the bridge under construction.) Those who were marching for the first time were pleasantly surprised by all the supportive honks and waves from passing vehicles as we honoured spectrum of sexual orientations and gender identities. As the parade ended at

the steps of the legislature various community groups, politicians and University groups made speeches with a sense of hope and as Kelly had described in announcements – A celebration of life. Participants received positive response for the churches' visible presence in this celebration of diversity. We hope that each year more Sunset participants will join in this celebration and that our new banner can be used many times through the year to share the message that “God’s Love Includes All.”

Family Ministries

Over the past year, I have been reading a book called Family based Youth Ministry by Mark Devries. It has converted me to the importance of shifting our youth ministry to provide more opportunities for youth and adults to interact and build meaningful relationships, including with their parents. The basic premise of the book is that what builds young people into mature Christian adulthood is having meaningful relationships with other adult Christians. It believes this can start with children as well. To this end, I would like to offer some family ministry programming throughout the year. There will be a few family based youth ministry programs which will bring youth and adults together (primarily their parents, but not necessarily) to explore issues of faith and life and get to know one another better – in ways not usually offered. I would also like to offer opportunities for families of children to gather, together with their children to explore issues of faith that can also provide tools for how we nurture our faith at home with children. There could also be some more social multi-generational gatherings like an all ages dance which we have done before with great success. I also recognize and acknowledge that our Musical is already an important family/multi-generational ministry which we need to celebrate! Watch for these new opportunities and if you have ideas of things you'd like to see for our families please let me know. **Our first session will be with youth and adults October 17. TGIF will meet at 4:30 pm and parents and older youth with their parents are invited to come for a pot-luck at 6pm, followed by a program for all.**

New Elements to our Sunday School Program

Following our meeting with Sunday school teachers in the spring, there have been some new ideas which we are implementing for our program this year. We will be continuing with our format of gathering the children (age 3-grade 3) for some singing, introducing the story, and then break into two groups (age 3-5 and K-grade 1) for creative time. The grades 4-8 will be in class from the beginning of the Sunday school time. So we have and need teachers for the introduction time, the craft time, and the grade 4-8 class(es). We also decided to continue introducing Godly Play to the program and our Advent and Lent season will use the Godly Play teaching method. To

this end, we will have an orientation for all teachers and anyone wishing to learn more about this storytelling teaching style on October 4. Each Godly Play session will have one storyteller (teacher) and one "doorkeeper" who welcomes the children and supports the teacher. We are thankful to Cal Newman, George Achtymychuk & Jason Krall for helping create wood materials needed. We also will be drawing on folk from the congregation who I think have some gifts or experiences to share with the children. All of these elements will lend to a lighter load for teachers, especially if we have a good team of volunteers. Please consider if you can offer some of your time to this important ministry. Here is the schedule for the fall to give you a sense of our program:

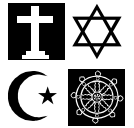
SOME FALL FAITH DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Revenue and expenditures as of August 31, 2009 are outlined above. Based on the current forecast, expenditures this year should approximate the 2009 approved budget expenditure of \$266,757.

The \$147,834 in revenue from January 1, 2009 to August 31, 2009 compares to revenue of \$155,713 during the same period last year.

This is potentially problematic because **2009 expenditures are expected to be about \$14,000 more** in 2009 than they were in 2008 and **revenue to August 31 is about \$8,000 less than last year.**

Assuming 2009 expenditures will come in on budget, we will need revenue of about \$119,000 between September 1 and December 31, 2009 to avoid a deficit. This means we will need to average almost \$30,000 per month in revenue from all sources for the last four months of this year.

The cover of Sunset's Annual Report for 2008 bore the slogan **"YES WE CAN"**. Thank you all for your contributions to date and for your participation in providing the resources needed to maintain Sunset United Church as a vibrant and caring community.
