### *Fall Reflection – Kathy Platt*

Martin Luther King Jr. offered these words: *“Take the first step in faith. You don’t have to see the whole staircase, just take the first step.”* And: *“Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. I can never be what I ought to be until you are what you ought to be. This is the interrelated structure of reality.”* This next season of the church is going to be a challenging one for a wide variety of reasons. The Board will be discerning how to ask us to dig a little deeper so that we can both balance our own budget, and reach our pledge to the Mission and Service Fund of the national church. Added to our own local costs, the cries of the vulnerable from all around the world are getting louder – it is hard to ignore the pictures of the children from Somalia. Where and how we choose to spend our money is a constant dilemma. We live in a crazy world that can spend billions on the weddings of the rich and famous, and yet can’t provide enough affordable housing to enable people to find shelter off of the city streets. As part of my sabbatical this fall I am going to be spending a month with Tim Wright and Sauti Moja – a Canadian Charity located in Kenya and Tanzania. I will be seeing first-hand the realities of the drought and witnessing the strength of the Spirit that enables the most vulnerable to keep on walking, even in the face of intense struggles. I wonder how we, here in the city of Regina, can make sense of this world that pulls at both our pocket-books and our heart-strings? How do we not feel so overwhelmed that we feel frozen, or consumed by guilt? Part of it is just to take that first step – we can’t possibly know how the little that we do will affect the rest of the world – often it is more a leap of faith than walking a well laid out path. Am I nervous about taking this rather giant step of going to Africa? You bet I am! However, as Tim has reminded me often, it is not about the “project” of Sauti Moja – it is about looking into the eyes of those who have lived in very difficult circumstances and discovering what it is that enables them not to be defeated by the drought, or the oppression, or the poverty. It is about building relationship and discovering what I can learn about living fully in whatever situation we find ourselves. It is about trusting that God is at work in new and amazing ways in the most vulnerable areas of our world. And it is about coming back here to share all those stories so that we can all gain a better perspective about what is and what is not possible in our own realities.

A quote by Tommy Douglas: “*Courage my friends, it’s never too late to build a better world.*” As you begin to sort out what your priorities will be for this fall, I hope you consider what small step you could take to build a better world – perhaps it is to visit a neighbour who is ill or shut-in; perhaps it is to learn to knit a prayer shawl; perhaps it is offer to serve supper at the outreach centre (Rainbow Youth); perhaps it is the learn the name of at least one child in our Sunday School. You don’t have to take on the whole of the world – you don’t have to give to every organization that is appealing for your finances – but I strongly encourage you to try to do one small thing that works towards improving the quality of life for someone in this world. I look forward to hearing the stories of the ways in which you are engaged in the work of building a better world. Our creed says: “We are called to be the Church”...I hope and I pray that we will have the courage to step forward and truly be the Church that we are called to be – one small step at a time.

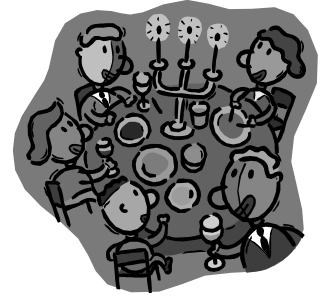

With a Ph.D. in Human Ecology and a master's degree in Museum Studies, Sherry Ann has experience with the research world and with community-education practice. She is Assistant Director (Lifelong Learning) of the Community-University Partnership for the Study of Children, Youth, and Families (CUP) and is Assistant Professor in the Faculty of Extension, University of Alberta. She is responsible for leading capacity-building activities particularly in terms of community-based research and evaluation. Sherry Ann's many and varied interests include dance and learning American Sign Language; she is part of the Edmonton International Folk Dancers and the Edmonton singing circle, Earth Sing.

Despite what the banners tell us just after Christmas, we all know that the real new year begins more or less right now, in September, as we pick back up our real lives after a summer of escape. Hopefully, we've all taken advantage of the sun, warmth and long days and now return to jobs, school, church and community work with renewed energy and fresh enthusiasm. Welcome back.

Life at Sunset is going to be a little different this year. Kathy Platt will be leaving on a Sabbatical for three months, starting in early October, a time for her to learn, reflect and grow. Meanwhile, we should ensure we're trying to do the same thing back here. We'll miss Kathy and everything she brings to Sunset, but she'll be back soon enough and her absence, in fact, gives us opportunities to be involved and engaged in different ways around here as we support Russell and each other in carrying on.

**Christian Education and youth.** We have two new "Co-ordinators" for the Sunday School: thank you, Colleen King and Heather Nelson. Sunday School is a vital part of a vibrant church and we all need to think about whether and how we can help out. You don't need to be a parent, or ever have been one, though it helps if you like kids or, at least, are not afraid of them. It's a task that can be as large or small as you have time, energy or inclination to give to it. We need people to help out with introducing the lesson, helping with the craft activities and general supervising. Those who have done it love doing it, but we can't continue to rely on the same few people year after year. Think about it.

**There are also opportunities to be involved with the children in the very popular Explorers program, which meets Thursday afternoons after school for about an hour and a half.** We need volunteers to help out with the snack and general support to the leaders and other parent volunteer. The Schools Day Out Program (December 2) can always use some help. There will be a couple of multi-generational worship services as well (November 6 and December 11).

**More opportunities.** There is nothing more comfortable than sitting in church and having the worship service unfold around you. But, once in a while, wouldn't we all like to be more active participants? Nod your heads. Kathy and Russell are willing to help people or teams of people who would like to learn about what's involved in preparing a worship service – planning the theme, preparing the readings, composing the prayers, laying out the bulletin and, finally, participating in the service itself. For example, the Prayer of the People is part of every service. We've fallen out of the practice of having a member of the congregation involved in the preparation and delivery of that prayer. Perhaps we ought to take that up again. You'll hear more about this, and how you can be

involved, in coming weeks. If you know now that this is something you'd be interested in helping with, let us know.

**Worship.** A lot of work and planning has already been done pursuant to our focus on learning and growing at Sunset. We have a number of special Sunday mornings lined up. Leslie Harrison, from Winnipeg, will be our guest in late November and will deliver a reflection on new and innovative ways of "being Church" in today's culture. We'll also host John Pentland from Hillhurst United Church in Calgary, who will describe that congregation's journey to becoming a vital, progressive and important presence in that city, a church with a very ambitious, robust and successful program for children and youth. Larissa Kanhai will share with us her experiences in Columbia. Scott Thompson and Ross Macnab will do a condensed version of their tribute to the United Church's "Song of Faith". We'll also have a musical production, a choir service and a 100 Mile Lunch, not all at the same time. Our complete schedule for October to January will be posted on the website and on our bulletin board by mid-September.

### **Update on our Sauti Moja Sponsorship**

We are in our third and final year of providing sponsorship to Sophia, a young mother pursuing further education through Sauti Moja. While it was initially hoped that Sophia would be able to use this sponsorship opportunity to complete high school, this proved to be too difficult for her, despite ongoing support from both the school and the Sauti Moja personnel. Given this reality, the decision was made last spring to transfer Sophia to a vocational type of program and she has been receiving training in a tailoring and garment making program since last May. We are grateful for Sauti Moja's ability to be responsive to the diverse learning capacities of their recipients, and that there were other opportunities available to Sophia to assist her in becoming a financially independent young lady.
