# SUMMER SCRIPT

# Summer Reflection From Kathy Platt

I read this quote in a book I have called Soul Weavings -A gathering of women's prayers:

I remember running over the hills just at dawn one summer's morning and, Pausing to rest in the silent woods, saw, through an arch in the trees, The sun rise over river, hill, and wide green meadows

As I never saw it before.

Something born of the lovely hour, a happy mood,
And the unfolding aspirations of a child's soul

Seemed to bring me very near to God...

(Louise May Alcott, 1832 – 1888)

As I sit here at my desk contemplating the approach of summer, that is a lovely thought – to see the sun rise over the water, or the mountain, or the prairie grass, and to allow such a sight to bring us ever closer to our Creator. This past Sunday we had our first outdoor service in several years. One of the pictures I will hold in my heart is right near the end of that service when the kids came dancing into the circle with the wind-socks they had made. We were celebrating Pentecost, which is when the early church felt the rush of the Spirit, and realized that it was the Spirit within them that would enable them to be the church that God was calling them to be – there was no need to be afraid because they had been filled with the Spirit which would enable them to be much more than they could ever have imagined on their own. We can get lost in either the hectic pace, or the humdrum of our daily living, and we lose sight of what it means to be Spirit-filled. And so it becomes even more important to open ourselves to those moments that bring us even closer to God – to the glimpse of a sun-rise that touches our hearts; to the giggles of little girls as they dance with their wind-socks; to the smile of a stranger passing by on the street; to the brilliance of the blue prairie sky; to the singing of the robins as they greet the new day (a little earlier than some of us would want to greet the day!!). Another book I have been spending time with is *Radical Gratitude*, by Mary Jo Leddy. She invites us into an attitude of gratitude and suggests that we need to remember the old maxim: "The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step. Faith is like a lantern on a dark path; it shines only far enough to illuminate the next step. Only when the next step is taken does the light move on. Our beginning steps in gratitude do not have to be great and grand. They need only be real."(p. 145 – in *Radical Gratitude*). So my wish for all of us this summer is that we will look at the world around us and be startled into seeing those holy moments – some moments might make us speechless; other moments might make us want to dance in the Spirit. Our lives are lived moment by moment – may we live each moment with integrity, with Spirit, and with gratitude.

# 2010-11 Sunday School Teaching Recruitment

We have a great group of children who we want to nurture and provide opportunities for exploring our faith. We all lead busy lives and even with a group of about 9 teachers this year, we have still had trouble finding enough help for each Sunday. So this fall we are trying something different. We are asking each parent to offer their time to support their children on Sunday by committing to helping at least two or three Sundays in the year.



We run one of two SS programs each week (other than the days listed below). One is the **Seasons of the Spirit curriculum** and the other is the **Godly Play program**.

#### Seasons of the Spirit curriculum

The Seasons of the Spirit format includes a group introduction session with all the kids together (age 3-grade 3) at the beginning of the Sunday school session. The kids love being together for the initial fellowship and with our wonderful round quilt to gather on, it has made for an amazing and cozy environment in which to offer the spiritual gift of learning to our children.

Once this is complete, the kids break into their respective age groups where their teachers lead the children in a craft, singing session, game or whatever is based around the initial discussion. At the end of either session, we gather the children back together for a final few moments of fellowship together.

The curriculum for this program is quite user friendly and easy to follow. All the info is provided for you and you may use it as is given or adapt it to fit your ideas, following the theme or story of the week. Most craft materials are available in the classrooms.

#### For each week of Seasons of the Spirit program, we need the following:

*Introduction* – Introduction of the story to the 3yr olds – gr. 3 (one person required)

Craft for age 3-5 (one person required)

Craft for grades 1-3 (one person required)

Grades 4-8 – teacher for the session (one person required)

## Godly Play program

In Godly Play children discover who God is through a definitive storyteller presentation as well as a creative time afterwards. The door person assists the storyteller in welcoming the kids, making sure they are 'ready' to sit quiet and listen to the story and during the creative time. Craft trays are set up for the creative time.

#### Each week of Godly Play, we need the following:

Story teller (one person required)

Door person (one person required)

At the end of either session, we gather the children back together for a final few moments of fellowship together.

We would also encourage others in the congregation to try teaching Sunday school as well. We want to make sure that *everyone* understands that you do not need to be a biblical scholar to teach or assist with Sunday school nor do you need to make a weekly commitment to it. Many of our teachers teach once a month or less. We also need you to understand that the time commitment to a weekly session is not, by any means, large. We encourage people to provide whatever commitment they feel comfortable offering. Any gift of your time would be appreciated.
